





STORY TIME!
Note for mum / teacher:
Read the story for the learner. Please read it twice. Ask him / her to tell
you what has happened in the story to determine if he / she has an
understanding of what has happened in the story.
After the story follows the pictures of the story. Let him / her look at
the pictures and let him/her explain what happens in the pictures.
Cut out the pictures (It works very well if you also laminate the
pictures). Start by giving only 3 pictures and tell the learner he / she
should place it for you in the correct order. For example, give him / her
the following 3 pictures:
1. Where lion catches a mouse.
2. Where lion is caught in the net.
3. Where mouse and lion are buddies and put a mouse on the lion's
back.
You have to give the pictures scrambled.
