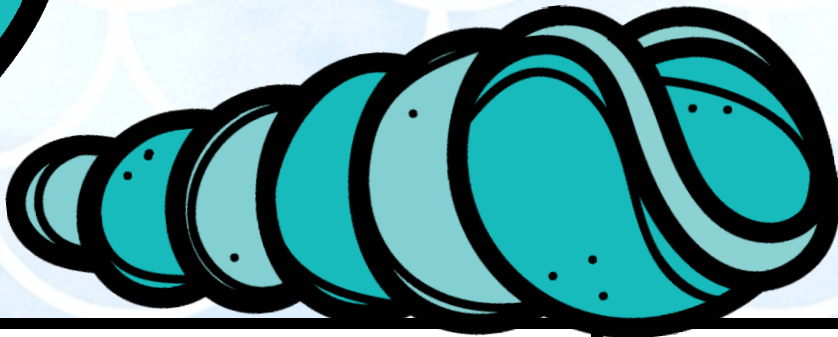
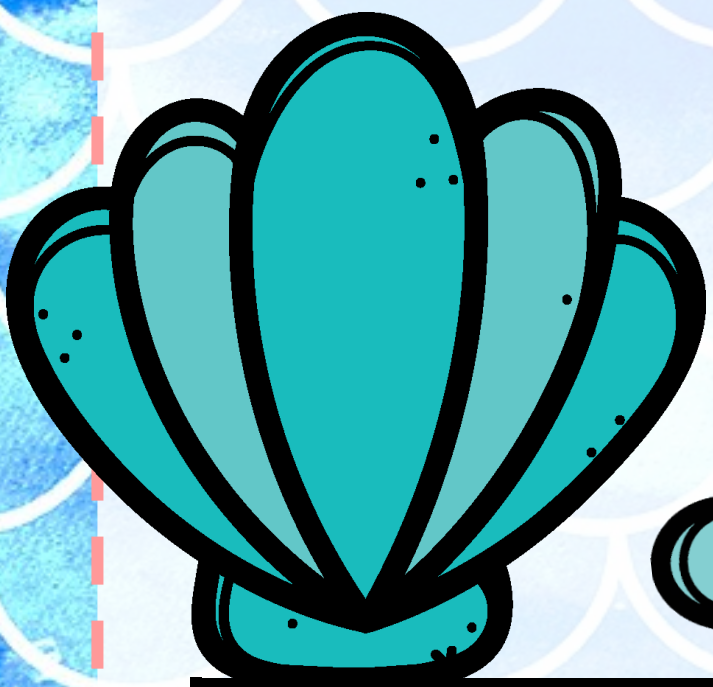

things.



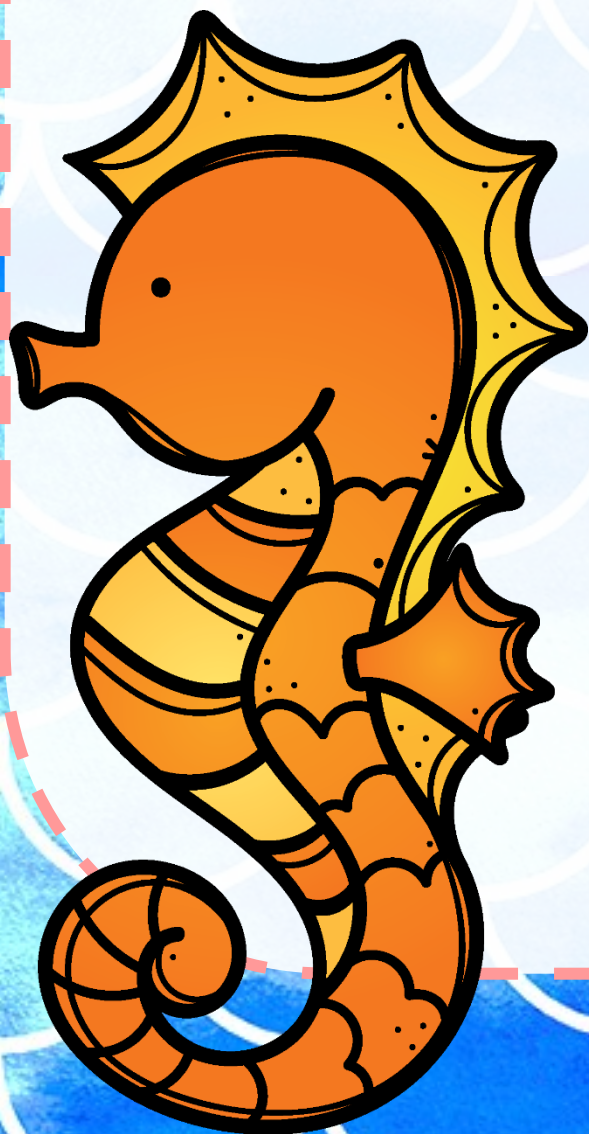
Person	Place	Animal	Thing
