

# NOUN

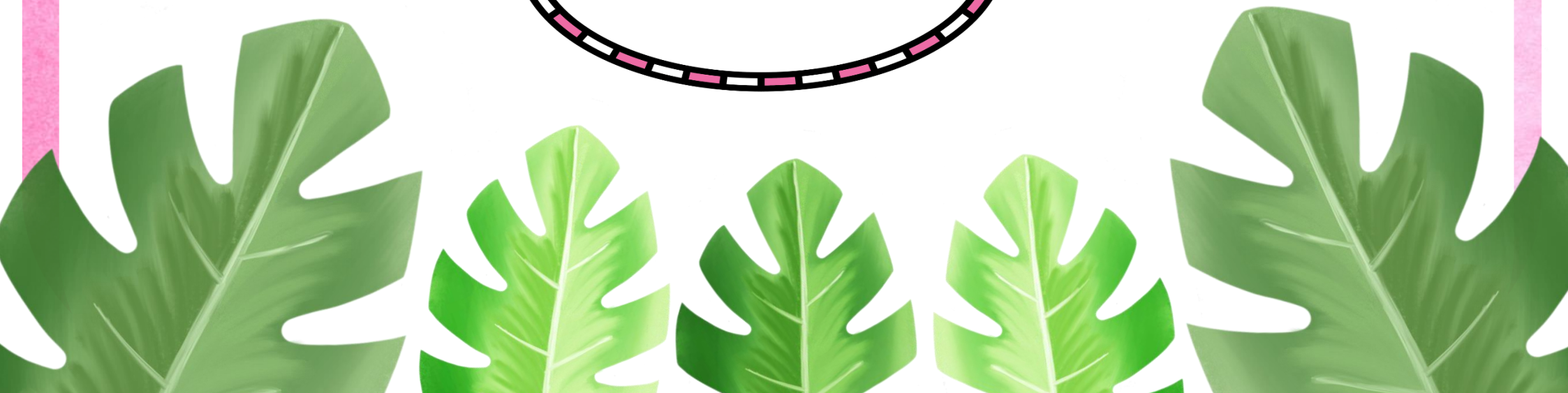
Name of a person, place or thing.

Example:

Tom

Pretoria

# ADVERB

An adverb describes a **verb** or an **adjective**.  
It tells us how, how often, where or when.

Example:

The dog ate quickly.  
Charlie is a fast runner.



# ADJECTIVE

An adjective gives more information about a **noun** or **pronoun**.

Example:

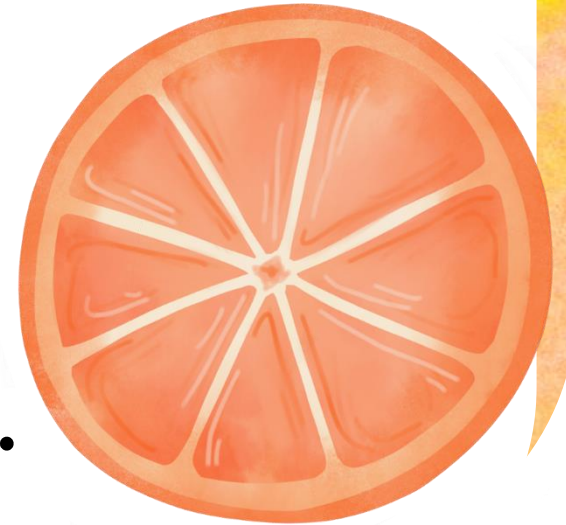
red

I have a red dress.  
They ate a large pizza.



# VERB

A verb is a word which describes the **action** in a sentence. It is a doing word.

Example:

We eat spaghetti.

I play soccer.



# CONJUNCTION

A conjunction joins two words, phrases or ideas.

Example:



or

but

because



yet

so

and

She has a red and blue dress.

I am hungry, but the fridge is empty.

# INTERJECTION

An interjection is a word that shows a strong emotion or feeling.

Example:

stop!

Oh, no!

ouch!

wow!

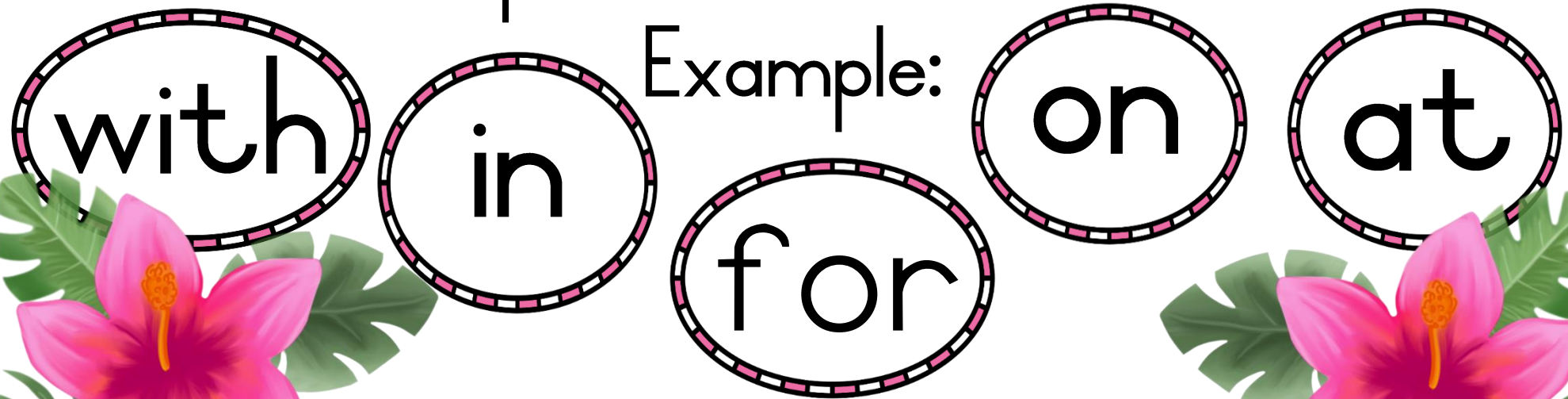
boom!

# PREPOSITION

A preposition shows the relationship of a noun or pronoun to another word.



The baby cried for a long time.  
We are going to have a picnic in the park.

A pronoun is used in place of a **noun**.
