

## comma



- I. A comma is used to separate items in a list or series.

  - Once upon a time, there was a little rabbit.
- 4. Use a comma after introductory words in a sentence.

  - Yes, I think it is a good idea.
  - Finally, we are going outside.




- 5. Use a comma in numerals.

## Full stop



- I. A full stop is used at the end of a sentence.
  - The man drives in a red car.


- 2. A full stop is also used after abbreviations.
  - Sunday Sun.
  - Mrs. Davidson gives me cookies.



## Question mark

A question mark is used at the end of a sentence to ask a question.

- I. How late is it?
- 2. When would you like to go to the park?
- 3. What is your favourite colour?
- 4. Where are we going on holiday?



## Exclamation mark

- I. An exclamation mark is used at the end of sentence to show the following:
- Joy Those flowers are so lovely!
- Anger You are making me angry!
- To ask for help Please help me!
- $\bullet$  Excitement or surprise I can't wait to go on holiday!
- 2. Sometimes we use exclamation marks after one word.
